Course Description:	
<p>Fashion Construction II utilizes individualized instruction with an emphasis on more advanced fashion construction techniques. The student will experience project based learning by applying advanced skills to project and garment construction. The teacher will facilitate student-choice based on interest and level of expertise with the expectation of developing higher level sewing, design, and construction skills. The student is required to provide his or her own sewing supplies.</p>	
Course Rationale:	
<p>Fashion Construction II is designed for the student interested in a career in fashion apparel, costume design, and more. This course utilizes more advanced garment construction techniques and textiles knowledge. Successful completion of this class provides students with an understanding of textile application and construction with an emphasis on quality.</p>	
Course Objectives:	
<p>The student will participate in the Family Career and Community Leaders of America program, including community service projects.</p> <p>The student will read about and examine fibers, fabrics, and finishes in textiles, compare the quality characteristics of fabrics, coordinate patterns and fabrics, investigate characteristics of fabric finishes, and work with a variety of fabrics on projects and assignments. (A+ Reading)</p> <p>The student will investigate and compare basic pattern alterations by analyzing personal fitting problems, applying alteration procedures to individual clothing construction projects. (A+ Research)</p>	

The student will demonstrate and explain advanced construction techniques and apply advanced techniques to complete sewing techniques projects (A+ Speaking and Listening)

The students will write about sewing procedures, project, and skills to reflect and evaluate. (A+ Writing)
