## COURSE RATIONALE

French II continues to develop students' second language skills, as well as the ability to function at a basic level in the larger world. The communication skills attained in the study of a foreign language are essential for greater career opportunities, the development of empathy and cultural awareness, and personal growth on the path to global and ethical citizenship.

## COURSE DESCRIPTION

French II is a communicative and proficiency based study of language. Students will continue their path to global citizenship by making connections beyond the content of the language to broader cultural themes. Students will extend their abilities in communicating about themselves, others, and the world around them in the present
and past. Through active participation, students will share and respond to preferences and basic needs. Students will present information and express their opinions as they interact with the French language through speaking, reading, writing, and listening.

## COURSE OBJECTIVES

The student will identify the topic and some isolated facts from simple sentences in short texts. (A+ Reading)

The student will understand familiar questions and statements from simple sentences in conversations. (A+ Speaking and Listening)

The student will request and provide information by asking and answering practiced and original questions on familiar and everyday topics, using simple sentences. (A+ Writing)

The student will interact with others to meet their basic needs related to routine everyday activities, using simple sentences and questions.

The student will express, ask about, and react to preferences, feelings, or opinions on familiar topics, using simple sentences and questions.

The student will present personal information and preferences about their life and activities, using simple sentences.

The student will present about others regarding everyday topics, using simple sentences.

The student will research and identify typical products and practices related to everyday life with respect to their own and other cultures. (A+ Research)
